Caring for your child during winter

- If your child is unwell, contact your GP who will be able to advise you on what to do. You can also call Shropdoc, the Out of Hours GP service, on 08444 06 88 88, or NHS 111 (England) or NHS Direct 0845 46 47 (if you live in Wales) if your child needs medical help fast but it's not a 999 emergency.
- If you need urgent medical advice, you can take your child to the Walk-in Centre, which from 15 December 2014 will be based at the Royal Shrewsbury Hospital.
- For life-threatening emergencies dial 999 and the ambulance will take you to the best place for your child's care and treatment.
- A&E departments at both the Princess Royal Hospital and the Royal Shrewsbury Hospital provide assessment and treatment in an emergency if you walk in, but if your child needs admission then the best place to be is the Shropshire Women and Children's Centre in Telford.
